CALL TO ORDER

President Reid called the Workshop of the Board of Park Commissioners to order at 6:00 p.m., followed by the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

INTRODUCTIONS

Superintendent Tuft introduced herself to the residents in attendance. Ms. Tuft explained that the PARC Grant can fund up to \$2.5 million of the Skatium project. Ms. Tuft said as part of the PARC Grant process a public hearing and community support are needed. Ms. Tuft turned the meeting over to Superintendent Guynn to present the Skatium Renovations and PARC Grant PowerPoint.

PROJECT GOALS, REVIEW AND SCHEDULE

Superintendent Guynn explained the history of the Skatium since it opened in October 1973 until present day. He discussed previous renovations to the facility and the proposed 2021 Skatium Renovations. The scope of the 2021 project includes removing and replacing 85 by

200 feet refrigerated concrete flooring, new ammonia-based ice rink refrigeration plant, two new humidifier systems, three new air handlers for both rinks, new boilers and hot water heating piping, new control panels and system to use to reclaimed heat to melt Zamboni snow. There are two alternates: New dasher boards and LED rink lighting. The construction timeline would be spring 2021 to completion in fall of 2021

PUBLIC INPUT

Ms. Crystal Johnson asked how many PARC Grants were available. Mr. Guynn responded the PARC Grant has \$25 million dollars available with a maximum grant of \$2.5 million per grant application.

Steve Glickman asked if the Skatium Renovation project was totally dependent on receiving the PARC Grant. Ms. Tuft responded the project will proceed as planned, the grant money would significantly reduce the cost to the District. Executive Director Ohrlund noted that the District needs to formally commit to the project when applying for the grant.

Ms. Tuft asked attendees to circulate a letter of support to be returned to Mr. Guynn by January 10th to be included with the PARC Grant application. Attendees expressed their support for the project.
