About this Program Guide Series

As the Skokie Park District celebrates its 85th Anniversary in 2013, we are proud to roll out the district's first full-color seasonal program guides. This year's guides will feature a full-color retro look, celebrating the district's rich history, largely from the 1940s to the 1970s, when color was taking off in the movies, in magazine advertising and on television. Some of the images (black-and-white and color) contained in this year's four guides have been pulled from the district's photo archives, thanks to the Skokie Heritage Museum and the Skokie Historical Society.

About the Cover

This season's cover features a photo (top) of the Skokie Heritage Museum, built in 1887 as the Niles Centre Volunteer Fire Company. Since then it has also served as village hall, a jail, a public school, and a venue for weddings, parties, dances, church gatherings and boxing matches. In 1898, the bell tower was erected to sound alarms. The building served as a firehouse until 1969. The Skokie Park District restored it in 1992.

Bottom photo: The field upon which these young men are practicing, c. 1931, is located on the site of Lincoln Junior High School at Babb and Lincoln Avenues. The photo looks southwest. The homes in the background are located on Niles Center Road. The large house to the right of the large tree, constructed in late 1924, was owned by Raymond Klehm and Myrtle Harms Klehm, descendants of Niles Center pioneers Henry Harms and George Klehm. The home is now owned by Richard Witry, vice-president of the Skokie Historical Society.



Niles Centre Public School (left) was built in 1898, with the village firehouse (front cover) serving as the school until construction was complete. The school was located across the street from the current Skokie Park Tennis Center on Madison and Niles Center Road.

In October, the district's critically-acclaimed senior acting troupe, Still Acting Up, will present a new performance entitled "Still Misbehavin' at the Moulin Bleu." In addition, the entire family can enjoy several unique Halloween events, including Scream Scene 2013, the Skokie Water Playground's annual haunted house, Things That Go Bump in the Night, a non-scary look at nature's creatures, and the Skatium Ice Arena's Halloween public skate and costume contest.

Through it all, residents will continue to golf, play softball, exercise, celebrate birthdays, pursue the arts, and enroll their children in childcare and preschool programs.



Visit an original Skokie Log Cabin

One of Skokie's oldest buildings was built around 1847 by the Meyer Family. The Meyers and 8 of their children lived in the cabin. Moved to this location in 1982, the cabin is now filled with 1800s-era furnishings and other belongings that pioneer families like the Meyer family would have used, giving visitors a sense of their living conditions and daily activities.

Pioneer Life Field Trips

School groups can schedule field trips to experience pioneer life in our historic log cabin and try pioneer toys. Times available: mornings Tuesday–Friday, and afternoons Tuesday and Wednesday. Grades: K–3
\$40 per School Group (usually not more than 25 students).

Pioneer Activities Program

This program is for scout groups or educational groups of not more than 15 children and includes a tour of the log cabin, candle dipping, making cornhusk dolls and playing with pioneer toys. Please schedule at least one month in advance and make payment at least 10 days prior to the program. Fee: \$75. Children must be at least 6 years old.

Historic Bike and Walking Tours

Explore Skokie's past by bike. Beginning at Emily Oaks Nature Center, this self-guided tour will cover historical points of interest on over 5 miles of Skokie streets. Maps are available at SkokieParks.org or at the Skokie Heritage Museum. A Historic Walking Tour of Downtown Skokie is also available at SkokieParks.org or at the Skokie Heritage Museum.





To obtain a Pooch Park permit download the "Cook County Animals and Rabies Ordinance Verification" at www.skokieparks.org/pooch-park. Forms are also available at Skokie Park District Community centers. Take the form to your veterinarian to be completed. Once the form has been completed and the waiver signed, bring the form with payment to the Oakton Community Center to get a printed permit. permit must be with you at all times when using Pooch Park

Pooch Park Rules and Regulations

- All dogs must be at least 4 months old.
- Dogs must be spayed or neutered by the age of 12 months. Un-neutered or un-spayed dogs over the age of 12 months will not be allowed to use the park and are subject to fine.
- Dogs must wear a current State Health Department license tag and be up-to-date on rabies, DHLPP and Bordetella shots. Dogs that are ill will not be allowed in the park. Proof of shots is required before membership can be sold.
- Dog owners are solely responsible for the actions of their dog(s). Owners must have voice control of their dogs, and prevent aggressive behavior, i.e., biting, fighting. Dogs must be leashed immediately and must exit the park if aggressive behavior is observed.
- Children must be supervised by an adult (18-years-old) to be in the park and must remain with the adult at all times.
- Dog owners are required to pick up dog feces and dispose of feces in the waste receptacles which are available throughout the park.
- No more than 2 dogs per person on any one visit.
- Dogs must be on a leash in the parking lot and walkways. Owners must keep the leash with them at all times.
- Owners are liable for damage/injury by their dog(s) to another dog, person or park property.
- Complaints or grievances may be submitted electronically at the park district web site (www.SkokieParks.org). If complaints are registered regarding aggressive behavior of your dog, or non-adherence of rules, membership may be revoked. Each incident will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
- The Skokie Park District and the City of Evanston are not responsible for the actions of the dogs and their owners. You enter this facility at your own risk, please be responsible and respect all other members of the park.

Puppy Obedience

Through positive reinforcement, new puppy owners will learn to correct existing problems and prevent future problem behaviors. Includes lessons in socialization, management and prevention exercises, house training, leash training, foundation obedience work, massage, grooming, nutrition and more. Open to puppies seven weeks to five months who have had their first sets of immunizations. Puppies attend all six classes with their owners.

Picnic Area Reservations

Park picnic areas available for rental include those at Central, Devonshire, Hamlin, Laramie, Lorel, Lockwood, Lyons, Oakton, Schack, and Terminal Parks. Reservations may be made on a "first-come-first serve" basis, with applications submitted beginning on March 1 for the current year (April 1 through September 30). Please make your request early in order to assure your preferred date and location. No reservations will be taken over the phone. Picnic area availability may be checked by calling (847) 674-1500, but available dates cannot be guaranteed until a "Special Park Usage Application" has been submitted and approved. Usage Applications may be filled out at the Weber, Oakton or Devonshire front desks. Security deposits are \$100 and must be submitted with the Usage Application. The application approval process takes at least one week. Resident picnic area fees are \$35 for five-hour blocks on weekdays and \$50 for five-hour blocks on weekend days & holidays (Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day). Non-residents fees are \$70 for five-hour blocks on weekdays and \$100 for five-hour blocks on weekend days & holidays (Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day). All above fees are doubled for 11 hour blocks and then discounted by \$15. Proof of residency is required to receive resident rates.

Athletic Field Reservations

Baseball, Softball, Soccer fields and our Cricket Practice Pitch can be reserved for group rentals. Please make your request early in order to assure your preferred date and location. The athletic field application approval process takes at least two weeks. For information call Bob DeLeonardis at (847) 674-1500, ext. 2183.

The following behavioral code of conduct will be used as a guideline for Skokie Park District program participants. Participants will:


1. Show respect to all other participants, staff, and volunteers.

4. Not use inappropriate, abusive, or foul language.
5. Not show any aggressive behavior (hitting, punching, slapping, kicking, biting, etc.) regardless if the behavior is initiated or in retaliation.
6. Not show continuous disruptive behavior.
7. Obey all Skokie Park District rules and regulations.

No Smoking in the Skokie Park District

In accordance with Illinois State Law and according to the Skokie Park District Usage Ordinance, Section C.26, smoking is not allowed in all Park District buildings, restrooms, and enclosed or partially enclosed sports arenas. Additionally, smoking is prohibited within 15 feet of all entrances, exits, windows that open, and ventilation intakes that serve these areas. Smoking is also prohibited within 50 feet of all parks, playgrounds, or other non-enclosed Park District facilities when organized children's activities or organized special events are present. Any person who violates any provision of the ordinance's Section C.26 shall be fined an amount that is not less than \$100 and not more than \$250. Each day a violation occurs will be considered a separate violation.

Public Notification Pesticide & Fertilizer Applications

The Skokie Park District will be making pesticide and fertilizer applications in various parks throughout the District including the Weber Park Golf Course. These applications are necessary to maintain the health and vigor of desirable plants and retain the aesthetic quality of our parks. Each park will be posted with signs in the specified application areas. Signs will be posted just prior to application and will remain until the following day. All procedures concerning notification and application of chemicals for the treatment of turf grass or plants shall conform to the guidelines outlined in the Skokie Park District's pesticide policy as well as State regulations.
