- You used to be able to get somewhere <u>swift</u> by stopping at this building. Don't let its old prairie style façade fool you, it's modern inside, and you're now more likely to grab a sip than take a trip.

- This relic from the 1933 Chicago World's Fair flies high as a symbol of our country, near a place of higher learning. Also, is a remnant of the former home of the Niles East Trojans.
- This is so neat, and it's under your feet when you walk down the street at 7800 Lincoln Ave. This piece of footwear commemorates the store that used to be there. Take a peek and compare your footwear to this.
- Our community is filled with many different cultures, but let us not forget those that were here before us. On the north side of town, near a playground, growing from the ground this wooden guide represents the Skokie area's first residents.
