

As the Skokie Park District celebrates its 85th Anniversary in 2013, we are proud to roll out the district's first full-color seasonal program guides. In July and August, check out the district's Summer Concerts and Movies in the Park, Pancake Breakfast in the Woods, golf tournaments and pool parties, the July 4th Parade and 3-D Fireworks Festival, and Skokie's Backlot Bash – this year headlined by The English Beat and Tributosaurus as Kool and the Gang.

Finally, you can also now purchase season Pool Passes to both of our water parks at great

discount prices. While visiting the Skokie Water Playground, be sure to drop by the Exploritorium, now featuring its new Engineering Mega Station.

So, whether you are a golf enthusiast, a child lacing up ice skates for the first time, an adult looking for a great workout facility, or just need to take a plunge in one of our great pools, we look forward to helping you find new ways to fill your free time this summer. 



Visit an original Skokie Log Cabin

One of Skokie's oldest buildings was built around 1847 by the Meyer Family. The Meyers and 8 of their children lived in the cabin. Moved to this location in 1982, the cabin is now filled with 1800s-era furnishings and other belongings that pioneer families like the Meyer family would have used, giving visitors a sense of their living conditions and daily activities.

Pioneer Life Field Trips

School groups can schedule field trips to experience pioneer life in our historic log cabin and try pioneer toys. Times available: mornings Tuesday-Friday, and afternoons Tuesday and Wednesday. Grades: K-3

\$40 per School Group (usually not more than 25 students).

Pioneer Activities Program

This program is for scout groups or educational groups of not more than 15 children and includes a tour of the log cabin, candle dipping, making cornhusk dolls and playing with pioneer toys. Please schedule at least one month in advance and make payment at least 10 days prior to the program. Fee: \$75. Children must be at least 6 years old.

Once the form has been completed and the waiver signed, bring the form with payment to the Oakton Community Center to get a printed permit. permit must be with you at all times when using Pooch Park

Pooch Park Rules and Regulations

- All dogs must be at least 4 months old.
- Dogs must be spayed or neutered by the age of 12 months. Un-neutered or unspayed dogs over the age of 12 months will not be allowed to use the park and are subject to fine.
- Dogs must wear a current State Health Department license tag and be up-to-date
 on rabies, DHLPP and Bordetella shots. Dogs that are ill will not be allowed in the
 park. Proof of shots is required before membership can be sold.
- Dog owners are solely responsible for the actions of their dog(s). Owners must have voice control of their dogs, and prevent aggressive behavior, i.e., biting, fighting. Dogs must be leashed immediately and must exit the park if aggressive behavior is observed.
- Children must be supervised by an adult (18-years-old) to be in the park and must remain with the adult at all times.
- Dog owners are required to pick up dog feces and dispose of feces in the waste receptacles which are available throughout the park.
- No more than 2 dogs per person on any one visit.
- Dogs must be on a leash in the parking lot and walkways. Owners must keep the leash with them at all times.
- Owners are liable for damage/injury by their dog(s)/to another dog, person or park property.
- Complaints or grievances may be submitted electronically at the park district web site (www.SkokieParks.org). If complaints are registered regarding aggressive behavior of your dog, or non-adherence of rules, membership may be revoked. Each incident will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
- The Skokie Park District and the City of Evanston are not responsible for the
 actions of the dogs and their owners. You enter this facility at your own risk,
 please be responsible and respect all other members of the park.

Aquatic Facility Reminders

- Lifeguards are on duty to enforce pool rules and respond to emergencies. Parents/ guardians are responsible for supervising their children.
- Children 10 and younger must be supervised by a responsible person, at least 16 years old, at all times.
- You must be 46" or pass a swim test to use the red, white & blue waterslides. Tightly-fitting rash guards may be worn on the waterslides, but no t-shirts, street clothing or lifejackets are allowed.
- Only Coast Guard Approved lifejackets may be worn. No other inflatables or floatation devices may be worn. Lifejackets are not a substitute for adult supervision.
- Young children not yet toilet trained must wear a swim diaper. All diaper changing must take place in the locker rooms.
- Do not swim if you are sick. Do not swallow, drink, or spout pool water.
- Take your child for frequent bathroom breaks- before it's too late! Be sure to wash hands thoroughly.
- All apparel worn in the water must be clean and designed for use in an aquatic environment. T-shirts or Rash Guards may be worn for sun protection. No street clothes are allowed in the water or on the waterslides. Patrons who must remain covered are encouraged to purchase full-coverage swimwear.
- No commercially prepared or carry-out food may be brought into our facilities. Homemade foods, sack lunches, and non-alcoholic beverages in plastic or aluminum containers are permitted.
- Anyone engaging in inappropriate or unsafe behavior will be asked to leave the facility without a refund.

Picnic Area Reservations

Park picnic areas available for rental include those at Central, Devonshire, Hamlin, Laramie, Lorel, Lockwood, Lyons, Oakton, Schack, and Terminal Parks. Reservations may be made on a "first-come-first serve" basis, with applications submitted beginning on March 1 for the current year (April 1 through September 30). Please make your request early in order to assure your preferred date and location. No reservations will be taken over the phone. Picnic area availability may be checked by calling (847) 674-1500, but available dates cannot be guaranteed until a "Special Park Usage Application" has been submitted and approved. Usage Applications may be filled out at the Weber, Oakton or Devonshire front desks. Security deposits are \$100 and must be submitted with the Usage Application. The application approval process takes at least one week. Resident picnic area fees are \$35 for five-hour blocks on weekdays and \$50 for five-hour blocks on weekend days & holidays (Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day). Non-residents fees are \$70 for five-hour blocks on weekdays and \$100 for five-hour blocks on weekend days & holidays (Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day). All above fees are doubled for 11 hour blocks and then discounted by \$15. Proof of residency is required to receive resident rates.

- 7. Obey all Skokie Park District rules and regulations.


No Smoking in the Skokie Park District

In accordance with Illinois State Law and according to the Skokie Park District Usage Ordinance, Section C.26, smoking is not allowed in all Park District buildings, restrooms, and enclosed or partially enclosed sports arenas. Additionally, smoking is prohibited within 15 feet of all entrances, exits, windows that open, and ventilation intakes that serve these areas. Smoking is also prohibited within 50 feet of all parks, playgrounds, or other non-enclosed Park District facilities when organized children's activities or organized special events are present. Any person who violates any provision of the ordinance's Section C.26 shall be fined an amount that is not less than \$100 and not more than \$250. Each day a violation occurs will be considered a separate violation.

Public Notification Pesticide & Fertilizer Applications

The Skokie Park District will be making pesticide and fertilizer applications in various parks throughout the District including the Weber Park Golf Course. These applications are necessary to maintain the health and vigor of desirable plants and retain the aesthetic quality of our parks. All procedures concerning notification and application of chemicals for the treatment of turf grass or plants shall conform to the guidelines outlined in the Skokie Park District's pesticide policy as well as State regulations.
