Skokie Park District Garden Plots 2013 <u>GUIDELINES</u>

Revised January 30, 2013

- All Plots are 20 x 20 feet. Gardeners are requested to plant their crops/produce within the boundaries of their assigned plot.
- Gardeners may fence off their assigned garden plot(s). However, gardeners are advised not to leave gardening tools in their plot area unattended as Garden Park is not a secured area.
- Garden Plot(s) will be available for planting on April 1, 2013 weather permitting. All garden plots will be plowed, staked, numbered and ready for planting.
- Please be advised that any garden plot (s) that has/have not been planted by May 15, 2013 may be forfeited and reassigned. The assigned gardener will be notified and must respond within 48 hours. Failure to do so may result in the reassignment of the garden plot and no refund of monies paid will be issued.
- Water is available for use at no additional charge and will be available depending on weather conditions. Please be advised that all gardeners will be required to provide their own hoses or bucket for water usage. <u>Please be sure to keep your garden hoses within your</u> garden plot area when not in use.
- At no time should any sprinkler or garden hoses be left unattended. All hoses should be attended to by the gardener when water is running.
- Absolutely no carpeting or landscape fabric is allowed anyplace in the garden plot area. This material gets caught in the tillers and mowers causing a disruption in the maintenance provided.

OVER

- Gardeners are encouraged to maintain their plots and keep them weed-free. Gardeners are expected to weed and maintain their entire plot area. Please do not leave weeds or any other trash in the walkways/aisles.
- Gardeners may not plant outside or beyond the boundaries of their assigned plot (in the pedestrian walkways/aisles.) Any planting outside of the assigned plot will be removed.
- Due to the nature of this program, we are unable to secure Garden Park against vandalism. Although loss of vegetation is usually kept to a minimum, each gardener should be aware of this potential situation. The Skokie Park District will not be responsible for theft, damage, vandalism or any other acts of destruction, loss or irresponsibility.
- <u>The use of chemically enhanced fertilizers or pesticides are</u> <u>forbidden</u>. Additionally, the Skokie Park District reserves the right to remove any questionable vegetation.
- Skokie Park District Clean-up of Garden Park begins on November 1st, 2013. Please be sure to remove all belongings and produce by this time.
- Failure to follow the policies set forth may result in the loss of your assigned garden plot for the following gardening year.

Gardening Tips

- Mulch your garden to help control weeds, save moisture and prevent the soil temperature from rising too high. Mulching also provides a protective covering for the soil.
- Arrange your crops properly to get the most out of your gardening experience.

OVER

- Be considerate of the gardener next you when planting taller plants which tend to shade smaller plants. Be sure to plant tall plants to one side or the back of your plot area.
- Vine plants should be planted away from the walkways/aisles for better protection from mowers or people walking through the garden area.

Important Dates to Remember

- April 1, 2013 Weather permitting, you may begin planting on your plot.
- May 15, 2013 Your garden plot must be started or it may be forfeited and reassigned. The assigned gardener will be notified and must respond within 48 hours. Failure to do so may result in the reassignment of the garden plot and no refund of monies paid will be issued.
- April 1 through October 31, 2013 Happy Gardening!
- October 31, 2013 Last day to remove any produce or belongings from your garden plot.
- November 1, 2013 The Skokie Park District's Park Services Department will begin clean-up of the garden plots in Garden Park.
